In 2008 the United Nations Industrial Development Organization began a project to enhance the capacity of Khartoum state vocational training services.

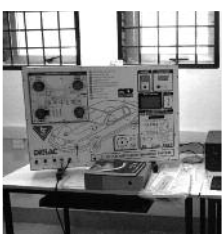
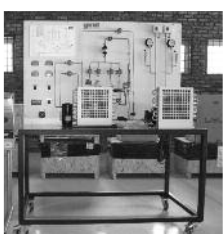
As part of this project five vocational training centres in and around Khartoum were rehabilitated and re-equipped.

The faculties installed across these five centres included Building and Construction, Automotive, Information Computer Technology, Electronics, Welding, Machining and Heating, Ventilation, Air-conditioning and refrigeration.

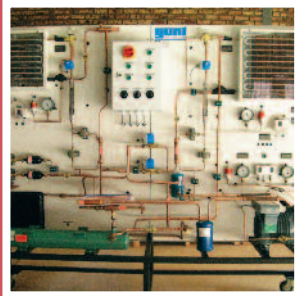
